LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE MEETING RECAP

SB3 (Beall) – Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2018

- This bill would enact the Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2018, which, if adopted, would authorize the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$3,000,000,000 pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. Proceeds from the sale of these bonds would be used to finance various existing housing programs, as well as infill infrastructure financing and affordable housing matching grant programs, as provided. This bill would provide for submission of the bond act to the voters at the November 6, 2018, statewide general election in accordance with specified law.

COMMITTEE DECISION:

- Legislative Analyst Ilissa Gold broke down how much funding would be allocated to cities under this bond.
- Lindsey Horvath made the motion to recommend a stance of **SUPPORT** to the Executive Board, Steve Hofbauer seconded. Motion carried.

SB 268 (Mendoza)—Alcoholism or Drug Abuse Treatment Facilities: Orange County Pilot Program

- This bill would reduce the members of the board of supervisors on the MTA board from 5 to 2 members and would require that one supervisor represent the largest population in the unincorporated area of the County of Los Angeles. This bill would also delete the appointment of two public members and require the Mayor of the City of Los Angeles to appoint 5 members of the City Council of the City of Los Angeles who represent contiguous clusters of 3 council districts.

COMMITTEE DECISION:

- Lou LaMonte expressed strong support for the bill as it would increase representation for cities and cause the Metro board to better reflect the makeup of Los Angeles County, while Lindsey Horvath cautioned about LA County's strong opposition to the change.

- Lindsey Horvath made the motion to recommend a stance of **NEUTRAL** to the Executive Board, Sam Pedroza seconded. Motion failed.
- Lou LaMonte made the motion to recommend a stance of **SUPPORT** to the Executive Board, Steve Hofbauer seconded. Motion carried.
