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

SESSION 1



FATHER GREG BOYLE, FOUNDER, HOMEBOY INDUSTRIES

Rev. Gregory J. Boyle, S.J. is the Founder and Executive Director of Homeboy Industries.

Father Gregory Boyle was born in Los Angeles and is one of eight children. He entered the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1972 and was ordained a priest in 1984. He received his BA in English from Gonzaga University, an MA in English from Loyola Marymount University and advanced theology degrees from The Weston School of Theology and the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley.

He has taught at Loyola High School in Los Angeles; was chaplain in the Islas Marias Penal Colony in Mexico and at Folsom prison and worked with Christian Base Communities in Cochabamba, Bolivia. He was appointed pastor of Dolores Mission Church in the Boyle Heights neighborhood of Los Angeles in 1986 where he served through 1992. Homeboy Industries was born 1988 and is now the largest gang intervention, re-hab and re-entry program in the United States.

Father Greg is the author of the New York Times Bestselling book, "Tattoos on the Heart: The Power of Boundless Compassion." His debut book has been honored by SCIBA (Southern California Indie Booksellers Association), Pen USA, Publishers Weekly, and Goodreads Choice Awards. He has received numerous honorary degrees, awards and recognitions including the Civic Medal of Honor, the California Peace Prize, Humanitarian of the Year from Bon Appetit Magazine, and in 2011 was inducted into the California Hall of Fame. He has served on the State Commission for Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, The National Youth Gang Center Board and the Attorney General's Defending Childhood Task Force.

LINDSEY P. HORVATH,
MAYOR, CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD
(L.A. COUNTY SUPERVISOR, 3RD DISTRICT)

Mayor Lindsey P. Horvath was elected to the West Hollywood City Council on March 3, 2015. She previously served as a Councilmember for two years from 2009-2011.

Mayor Horvath has a long history of civic and social justice advocacy. She has spearheaded policies to make West Hollywood an "Age-Friendly Community" to better serve residents of all ages. She also champions LGBTQ rights, and has led initiatives to denounce discriminatory legislation against LGBTQ individuals. Mayor Horvath is also known for her leadership on women's issues and served as a Global Coordinator for One Billion Rising, a global campaign to end violence against women and girls.

Additionally, Mayor Horvath has worked on a range of transportation and mobility issues. Most recently, she engaged in community advocacy to promote light rail and subway service to West Hollywood and is committed to making West Hollywood both pedestrian- and bicycle-friendly.

In addition to her service as an elected official, Mayor Horvath works as an entertainment advertising executive, and has created award-winning campaigns for both movies and television.

SUPERVISOR JANICE HAHN, LOS ANGELES COUNTY, 4TH DISTRICT

Supervisor Janice Hahn was elected to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors on November 8, 2016, representing the Fourth Supervisorial District. She has followed in the footsteps of her father, the legendary LA County Supervisor Kenny Hahn, in every step of her career. She began her public service in 1997, representing the Fifteenth District on the Los Angeles Charter Reform Commission. In 2001, Supervisor Hahn was elected as the Fifteenth District Councilwoman on the Los Angeles City Council where she served for ten years. In 2011, Supervisor Hahn was elected to Congress, serving for five years before her election to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.



MARINA TORRES, ASSISTANT U.S. ATTORNEY (L.A. CITY ATTORNEY)

Marina A. Torres is a federal prosecutor specializing in international narcotics, money laundering and racketeering matters, and is running to be the next City Attorney for Los Angeles. She was a political appointee with the Department of Homeland Security under President Obama, where she was part of the policy team leading the design and implementation of the President's executive actions on immigration. She has been honored for her immigration and civil rights work numerous times, as well as by various law enforcement agencies for her criminal prosecution work. Ms. Torres received her law degree from Stanford Law School and her BA from the University of California at Berkeley. She is a 1st-generation Latina with family roots in Michoacán and Jalisco, Mexico.

City of Norwalk Mayor Jennifer Perez, is currently serving her second mayoral term since being elected back in 2017. Mayor Perez started her career by volunteering with the Santa's Sleigh Foundation in her teens. She would later go on to work at Norwalk Toyota while being very involved with St. Linus Church's community outreach ministries which were both instrumental in developing her work ethic, values and ideals. She emerged herself in many facets of the community's culture, going on to join the City's Planning Commission where she learned about state development mandates and RHNA numbers. She broadened her experience on that advisory body and became aware of the importance of local control decisions for all cities, while garnering an understanding that not everything can be handeled with a one-size-fits-all approach. Once elected to the Norwalk City Council, Mayor Perez wasted no time aligning herself with associations that would positively impact her as an elected official, Contract Cities was her first choice! As an active participant and one of two co-chairs for the Legislative Committee on the Executive Board, she has a first-hand knowledge of the value of local control and how priceless it is now more than ever!

Jed Leano serves as Mayor Pro Tem for City of Claremont, Chair of the San Gabriel Valley Regional Housing Trust, Vice Chair of Tricity Mental Health, and works as an immigration lawyer in private practice.



STACEY ARMATO,COUNCILMEMBER, CITY OF HERMOSA BEACH

Stacey Armato has served on the Hermosa Beach City Council since being elected in March 2016. She is also a Director at Inceptiv, a dedicated community advocate and volunteer, and a mother of three children. Stacey serves as the Treasurer for Independent Cities Association, Legislative Co-Chair for California Contract Cities Association, Legislative Chair for the South Bay Cities Council of Governments, Treasurer for BreastfeedLA, Board Member for California Women's Law Center, Co-Chair of Winemasters and Advocacy Chair for the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation-LA, and Board Member of the Parent Advisory Council for Mattel UCLA Children's Hospital. Stacey received her undergraduate degree in Gerontology from the University of Southern California and her law degree from Pepperdine University School of Law.

BILL BRAND,MAYOR, CITY OF REDONDO BEACH

Mayor Bill Brand first became a citizen-activist in 2001. After 8 years of activism, he was elected to the City Council of Redondo Beach as a slow-growth candidate. He was re-elected in 2013, and elected Mayor in 2017. He was recently re-elected to another 4-year term.

Mayor Brand first authored a statewide initiative to make zoning and land use municipal affairs over three years ago. This past March, Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi introduced it as ACA 7, co-authored by State Senator Steven Glazer. After ACA 7 was not heard by the Legislature, Mayor Brand, with four other proponents, submitted the initiative to the Attorney General for title and summary to appear on the November 2022 ballot.

Mayor Brand holds a degree in chemical engineering from Cal State Long Beach, and an MBA with a concentration in finance from the University of Southern California. He has co-authored three local initiatives, two of which were overwhelmingly approved by the voters of Redondo Beach. The third one was narrowly defeated.

SESSION 3B



SHERIFF ALEX VILLANUEVA, LASD

Sheriff Alex Villanueva is the 33rd Sheriff of Los Angeles County and a 34-year veteran of the Department. Sheriff Villanueva commands the largest Sheriff's Department in the United States, consisting of nearly 18,000 budgeted sworn and professional staff. As Sheriff, he has initiated reform efforts that are improving morale within the Department, as well as, rebuilding trust within the communities, which the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) serves.

Sheriff Villanueva began his law enforcement career in 1986 working within the Los Angeles County Jails. For the next 30 plus years he worked a variety of assignments, at various ranks before retiring in early 2018. He was elected as Sheriff in November of 2018.

REX RICHARDSON, VICE MAYOR, CITY OF LONG BEACH

Rex Richardson was elected to the Long Beach City Council in 2014 to represent the neighborhoods of North Long Beach in District 9 and serves as Chair of the Economic Development Committee and the Long Beach Housing Authority.

Councilmember Richardson's history in Long Beach is grounded in advocating for our most vulnerable residents and empowering communities to have a seat at the table and an opportunity to thrive.

City-wide, Councilmember Richardson has worked to shift the culture of City Hall by embracing a systemic and collaborative approach to solving the city's challenges. Richardson championed the creation of the Long Beach Office of Equity, to help address the economic and health disparities affecting Long Beach neighborhoods, and spearheaded a number of innovative initiatives that provide more opportunities to close the gap for our vulnerable populations, including the Long Beach My Brother's Keeper Initiative, and the PATH Young Adult Diversion program.



MARIO TRUJILLO, SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO D.A. GEORGE GASCÓN

Mario Trujillo has served as a prosecutor, primarily in the South East region of Los Angeles County, with assignments in the Whittier, Compton, Bellflower, and Norwalk courthouses. His last trial assignment was with the Hard-Core Gang Division, prosecuting many of the most difficult gang-related murder cases in the county.

During his first year in the division, Mario prosecuted more trials than any other attorney in the unit. He also served as a felony prosecutor in the Victim Impact Program, handling emotionally charged and sensitive felony cases. These cases involved the physical and sexual abuse of children as well as domestic violence cases. His experience as a trial attorney includes 115 jury trials – 85 felonies and 30 misdemeanors – including 22 murder cases. His 95% conviction rate is a testament to this hard work and dedication to justice.

From 2010 to 2012, he served as the Deputy in Charge of the District Attorney's Bellflower office, managing day-to-day operations and supervising attorneys and support staff. Before serving as a supervisor for the office, he worked in administration, serving as a Special Assistant to the Directors of Branch and Area Operations. Mario is currently assigned to Los Angeles County Hall of Justice where he works directly with Los Angeles County District Attorney George Gascon.

JOHN LEONARD, COMMUNITY & LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS MANAGER, CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD

Mr. Leonard manages the Community and Legislative Affairs Division, which serves as staff to the City Council, oversees City legislative affairs and community outreach, and provides assistance to the City Manager for special projects. He is the lead staff member to the Mayor and City Council members, including oversight of Council initiatives, management of Council staff, and strategic advisory to Council members.

In addition, Mr. Leonard manages responses to all constituent inquiries received by the City Council and division staff. He also manages the City's legislative program, including providing strategic direction based on the City's priorities, overseeing the City's lobbyists, and working closely with state and federal representatives.

After graduating, she attended San Diego Mesa College.

Yesenia ran for City Council because she wanted a city government that represents ALL of Avalon, especially the working class, and the 68.9% of us that comprise our strong Hispanic community. She also ran for her son, and a desire to create a better Avalon for him. Yesenia formyl believes it's time fo her generation to raise our voices and take responsibility for making the changes we want to see.

STEPHAN TUCKER, GENERAL MANAGER, WATER REPLENISHMENT DISTRICT OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

Stephan D. Tucker currently serves as the General Manager of the Water Replenishment District. He is a successful program management director and mechanical engineer with more than 34 years of experience managing significant programs. Prior to being appointed as the General Manager of WRD, Stephan assumed a variety of managerial positions at the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power. Mr. Tucker graduated with a B.A. in Religion from Morehouse College, a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from California State University, Northridge, and an M.B.A in General Management from Pepperdine University.



SCOTT HOUSTON, DISTRICT 4 DIRECTOR, WEST BASIN MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT

He oversees \$1.9 billion annual budget, 1,800 employees, and extensive system of conveyance, storage, treatment and delivery infrastructure. Hagekhalil is a national water and infrastructure leader. He is a registered civil engineer and national board-certified environmental engineer, having earned both a bachelor's and master's degree in civil engineering. Before joining Metropolitan, he was appointed in 2018 by LA Mayor Garcetti as the general manager of StreetsLA. His responsibilities included oversight of the management, maintenance and improvement of the city's network of streets including climate adaptation, equity, and multi-benefit integrated solutions. Previously, he served nearly 10 years as assistant general manager of LA's Bureau of Sanitation, leading the city's wastewater and watershed protection programs including the 2040 One Water LA Plan. CAPT. JOHN GANNON, LASD

Captain John Gannon has been with the LA County Sheriff's Department for over 33 years. His background includes assignments at six Sheriff Stations where he worked and supervised virtually all patrol functions. In 2016, Captain Gannon was selected to oversee and expand the Department's Mental Evaluation Teams (MET), a collaboration with LA County Dept. of Mental Health. LASD MET increased from 5 co-response teams to 34 teams dispatched Countywide by a new 24-hour "Triage Help Desk" to respond with patrol in real time to mental health crises. Gannon co-developed the Risk Assessment & Management Program (RAMP) where 6 collaborative teams provide intense case management – helping at-risk patients beyond just the initial MET response. In 2018, he worked with the VA in Long Beach to create the nation's first "V-MET" co-response team where a VA officer and clinician meet MET and patrol deputies in the field to support veterans who present in 911-level crisis. This model is currently being evaluated by the VA for trial use from Hawaii to New York City. Gannon is a co-chair for the Alternative Crisis Response Committee in LA County - preparing for the 988 crisis call "system" coming in July of 2022.
