Dear Senator Cervantes,

The California Contract Cities Association (CCCA) writes to express our support of Senate Bill 1292, which allows the City of Los Angeles, Santa Monica, West Hollywood, Inglewood, San Diego, and/or Long Beach to utilize an enhanced curb management system to enforce parking violations or automate parking payments.

Parking and traffic enforcement is essential to keeping cities' streets safe, functional, and accessible. By allowing cities to implement automated camera- and sensor-based curb management systems, SB 1292 would address a wide range of safety and traffic-flow issues in commercial loading zones, bike lanes, no-stopping zones, and crosswalks in multiple Southern California communities. These automated systems would also ease the administrative burden of enforcement. We applaud Senator Richardson for her leadership on giving the City of Los Angeles, Santa Monica, West Hollywood, Inglewood, San Diego, or Long Beach more flexibility to employ technology that would improve safety, efficiency, and accessibility at the curb.

CCCA represents 80 cities throughout California. For more than 65 years, CCCA's mission has been to advance the benefits of the contracting model and strengthen local control.
